WHAT'S IN THE BOOK THAT'S NOT IN THE MOVIE?

The slap, *Great Expectations*, Darry's injury at work, Sandy's move to Florida, Sandy's returned letter, Dally's pulling a gun on a doctor, the man who gives Ponyboy a ride home, Chapter 11

WHAT'S IN THE MOVIE THAT'S NOT IN THE BOOK?

Ponyboy's knife wound on his throat, kids playing cards, Darry's pushing Ponyboy, nightmare of the train/car crash, campfires in the park, men at the oil well, owl, rabbit, mouse, and raccoon at the church, rain and mud at the rumble, store clerk firing a gun at Dally, red rubber ball

WHAT'S THE SAME?

Greasers, Socs, red Corvair, blue Mustang, Bob's murder, train ride, church fire, *Gone with the Wind*, "stay gold," rumble, Johnny's death, Dally's death, Ponyboy's English theme

THE MOVIE: SUMMARY

The following is a scene-by-scene comparison of the movie to the corresponding chapters in the book.

THE MOVIE: CHAPTER 1

OPENING SCENE: Ponyboy Curtis begins to write a theme for his high school English class. (**ACCURATE**) The theme begins: “When I stepped out into the bright sunlight from the darkness of the movie house, I had only two things on my mind: Paul Newman and a ride home.” (**ACCURATE**, but the fact that the book is a theme is revealed in the last lines of the book in Chapter 12) As Ponyboy steps out of the movie theater, a red Corvair drives up and members of the Socs gang call him a Greaser. (**ERROR:** In the book a red Corvair full of Socs follows him, but the Socs do not yell at him) The boys in the car taunt and harass Ponyboy on his walk home. (**ERROR:** Not in the book) Ponyboy bounces a small red ball as he walks along. (**ERROR:** Not in the book) As he walks through the railroad yard, the Socs throw objects at him from a bridge overhead. (**ERROR:** Not in the book) The Corvair nearly runs over Ponyboy. (**ERROR:** Not in the book)

As Ponyboy nears home the Socs in the car jump him and threaten to cut off his hair. (**ACCURATE**) Ponyboy screams for help. (**ACCURATE**) The Socs pin Ponyboy down, stuff a handkerchief in his mouth, and hit him. (**ACCURATE**) One of the Socs pricks Ponyboy’s throat with a knife. (**ERROR:** In the book a knife blade grazes the side of Ponyboy’s head in the scuffle) Some Greasers, including Ponyboy’s brothers Darry and Sodapop, show up and run the Socs off. (**ACCURATE**)
